



PREFACE: The Trii-Zine Ezine began as an email publication, in 2001. By 2003, it became obvious that email was no longer an effective vehicle of delivery for my ezine. I had discovered that 45% of my subscribers used AOL, and that they were not even receiving the email I was sending them. Not because they didn't want to receive it, but because the powers that be at AOL decided for them, that they didn't need to read what I sent.



At the same time, RSS was moving into the mainstream; I decided to hitch a ride. I joined Quikonnex, as a publisher, and began publishing my ezine to a Quikonnex RSS Channel. Now my ezine has gone from the inbox (trash) to being syndicated all over the Internet, reaching far more people than my email list ever did.

That was the best move I have ever made. Quikonnex is not just another blog service. Quikonnex is a complete and secure communications system. It allows me to interact with my subscribers. It lets my subscribers put my information right on their desktops, where it won't get lost. It provides them a way to communicate with me directly, without the worry of getting lost in my inbox. I receive their messages directly on my desktop, so that I can respond instantly.

This book here, is a guide to using this awesome communications system. Now if you want to communicate with me, or any other Quikonnex publisher, or member, you will now know how to do it.

I use DeskView 2G for sending private messages, publishing my ezine, holding private chats and full-blown conferences, and that's just the tip of the iceberg when it comes to all of the things that can be done with this hummer of an application.

DeskView 2G is the creation of Carolyn Peltier and Jim Gray, owners of Quikonnex.com; innovators in direct to desktop communications. This application is a free system provided to help every day Internet users

experience a safe and secure method of Internet communication. *For Windows OS Only.*

This desktop application will read any RSS feed, no matter what version it has been published in. You can subscribe to any RSS feed, and read them with DV2G. You will **receive desktop notification whenever any Quikonnex channel, you subscribe to, is updated.** Just open DeskView, login, and let it run in the background, minimized to your system tray.

There are so many things that you can do through DeskView 2G. **This guide will show you how to use all of the features.**

The first step, if you haven't already done so, is to download DeskView 2G, using the above link. If you have an older version of DeskView, please use the link at the top of the page to upgrade. As always, DV2G is free.

Save DV2G to your desktop, and double click to open it.

Next, login using your Qname and password. If you have not yet registered with Quikonnex, to get a Qname, you must do this first. Again, registration with [Quikonnex is free](http://quikonnex.com). Just click the registration button. <http://quikonnex.com/193>

Using DV2G

Once you have registered, and gotten your Qname, log in. By default, the DV2G opens to your channel summary panel.

The channel summary will always list the most recently updated Quikonnex channels (feeds) you are subscribed to; as seen in the image to the right.

This panel can be recalled, if you are currently using another panel, at any time, by clicking on the **News tab**. When the light bulb at the top of the tab is lit, this means that there has been an update to one of the channels (RSS feeds) that you have subscribed to. By clicking on the **News tab**, you will be returned to the **channel summary**, where the new headline(s) will be displayed.



To read the articles listed in the channel summary, just click the headline you'd like to read. This will open a new, larger window, where the article, can be viewed in its entirety.

The links that are displayed under the News tab perform the following operations when clicked:

- 1. Channel** - Shows the top 10 headlines for all of the Quikonnex channels you are subscribed to.
- 2. Pod casts** - Shows the newest pod casts that you are subscribed to.
- 3. Other News** - Shows the newest headlines for other RSS feeds that you are subscribed to and have bookmarked with DV2G.



By clicking on the **Messages tab**, the main panel will change to show you all of your private messages. These messages are sent and received through the Quikonnex private messaging system, known as, QMTP. (Quikonnex Message Text Protocol.) QMTP will be discussed thoroughly, later in this text.

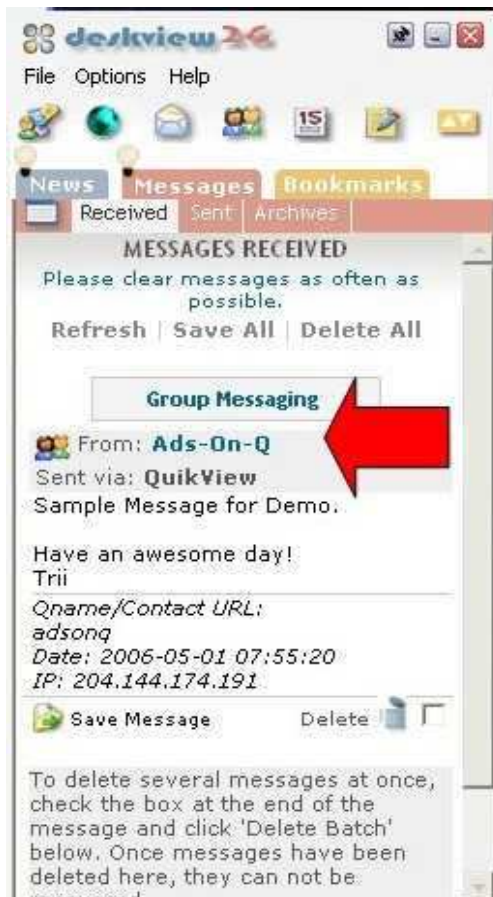
The Bookmarks tab changes the panel again, only this time it will show you all of the web pages and RSS feed links that you have saved to DV2G.

When you save links to your Bookmarks, you can also organize them into folders for easier location. This works the same way as saving to Internet Explorer Favorites, except that you can save XML pages (RSS feeds), too.

To create a new folder in Bookmarks, right click on the Bookmarks link, in the center panel, next to the blue and white arrow. Select **Add Folder** from the menu, and type in a name for the new folder. You can also use this menu for importing and exporting bookmarks from other programs, such as IE Favorites.

Private Messaging with QMTP

Quikonnex Message Text Protocol



There are several ways to use DV2G to send messages to other Quikonnex users.

1. Click on the MESSAGES tab, and click on the senders link. If they have left you an email address, your email client will open, allowing you to reply to their email address. If they have provided a Qname, the QMTP message box will open, and you can enter your reply, clicking on SUBMIT to send it to their QMTP message center.

2. If you know the Qname of the person you wish to contact, all you need to do is click on the **envelope icon**, and a QMTP message box will appear.

3. You can also click on the contacts icon, and your **contact manager** will open. Select the person you want to contact, from the list and click on the **Send Msg button** at the top of your contact manager. This will open a QMTP message box, with the Qname of the person already entered into the appropriate space.

4. The Group Messaging link allows you to create user groups and send a single QMTP message to multiple people at once.

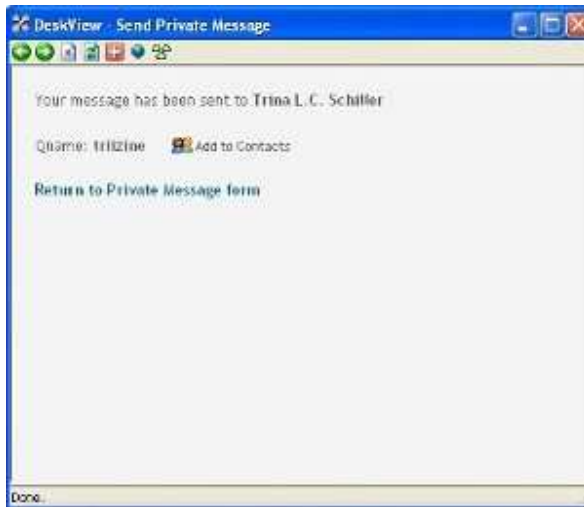

If you are sending a message to someone who is not already listed in your contact manager, and you want to add them, you can do so by clicking on the Add to Contacts icon inside the send confirmation window. (See image below.) This will automatically add the information to your contact manager, and all you need to do is **click on the save link at the bottom of the contact manager window**. (See contact manager image above.)

PANELS & LAUNCHERS

To add your favorite web pages and RSS feeds to your Bookmarks, click on the **PLUS icon** in the lower panel. The center panel will display the **Add Links** area as shown in the image on the left.

From the drop down box, choose the folder you would like to save the link to. Next, type or paste the name of the link into the box marked **Link Name**. Now type or paste the link URL into the box marked **URL**. You also have the option of adding a description of the link, for easy searching. Now just click submit. Your bookmark has been added.

Note: Only check the box marked Qchannel/RSS if the link you entered leads to an XML file. *DO NOT check this box if the link you entered is to an HTML web page.*

Add Channel Tab:

Click on the Add Channel tab if you want to bookmark a Quikonnex channel, knowing the channel's short name, or Qname. For example: If you wanted to bookmark the AdsOnQ channel, you would enter ads-on-q into the box. When you click ENTER, the panel will revert to the Add Links view, and all of the information in the boxes will be filled out for you, automatically. Now just click on submit.

Tuning & Re-tuning Your DeskView

When you tune your DeskView, what you are in essence doing, is very similar to tuning your stereo to a specific radio station. Right now, your DeskView is tuned to The Trii-Zine Ezine Channel. However, you can tune your DeskView to any Quikonnex channel, whose publisher has created a registered application.

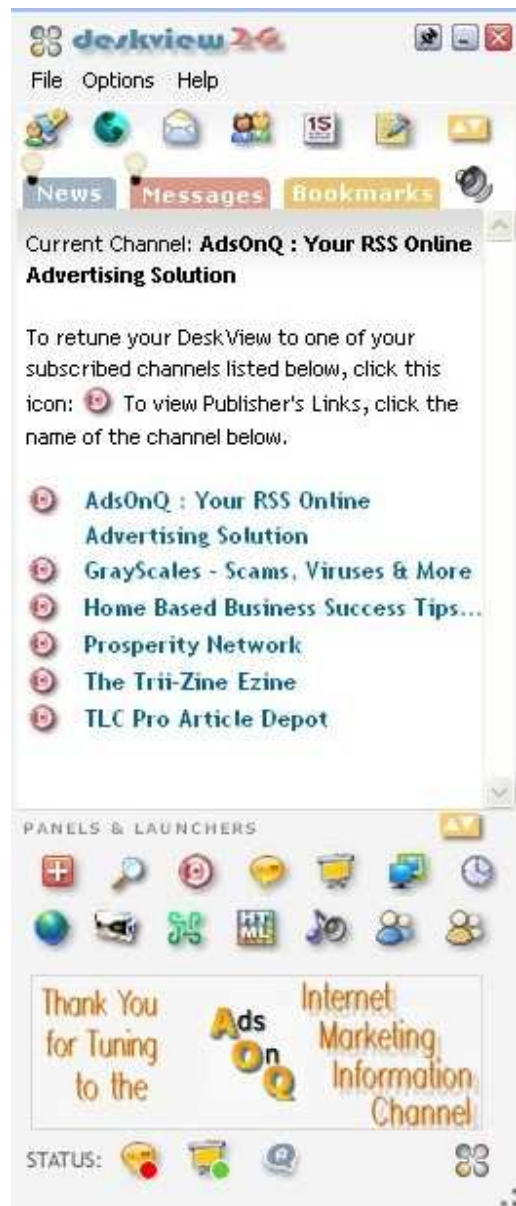
You must first, subscribe to the channel you want to tune your DeskView to.

NOTE: You do not have to have your DeskView tuned to a channel in order to view it. You can read any Quikonnex channel, or other RSS feed through DeskView.

The purpose of tuning to a specific channel is the same as having your favorite station tuned into your radio.

Below is the DeskView for another RSS feed that I publish: AdsOnQ.

This is a view of my tuner panel. **To change the channel** from one to another, all I would do is click the red button next to the channel name I choose. A confirmation panel will appear, and you either click **YES to re-tune**, or **NO**, if you changed your mind. It's that simple.



To subscribe to a channel, just go the channel page and click on the Q Subscribe link or the Golden Q icon.

To subscribe to the Trii-Zine, you would go to this link:

You can also use the Quikonnex Directory to locate other Quikonnex publications to subscribe to.

In this panel, you can see which of your presently online, using DeskView, you members to chat with you, and you can change your online status from ON to *can also separate your publisher chat from your regular member chat* Adding members to your chat list is just of typing a Qname into the add box, and clicking **ADD QNAME**.



Conference Rooms

Clicking this icon opens up the conferencing system.

The following packages are available for order by Q Publishers only.

Using the icons seen in this panel, you can locate conference rooms that you would like to join in on. Each icon represents a different category.

To enter a conference room, just click on the **guest entry** button. If you enter a room that is unattended, you may request a moderator join the room by clicking on the **request moderator** link. The **moderator login** button would be used only if you have your own conference room, or have been given moderator access by another room owner.



Remote Desktop Sharing

This is a free service that allows users to share their desktops' with other people. This is an excellent tool for teaching. It permits you to physically demonstrate a concept or an action by letting others view what you are doing on your computer.

Just click on the DV icon, and sign up with SkyFexFree to use the service.





In the next section of this tutorial, I will be discussing the navigation of the member's area.

Your Quikonnex Members Area



Member Information

The first icon you see here is for your member/affiliate information. You use this icon to complete or change your Quikonnex member information. This is where you would enter your PayPal information in order to be paid commissions for referring new publishers to Quikonnex, changing your password, and setting up other important contact info.

Add-Ons & Upgrades

In this area, you will find all the available upgrades to your system, including changing your status from a free member to a publisher, as well as adding conferencing to your system. (You must first become a publisher to add the conferencing feature.)

Your Links

This area describes for you how to set up and track your affiliate links for referring new members to Quikonnex.

Conference Room Manager

This area is where you would manage any conference rooms you have purchased through TTC Global Talk. You may also purchase a room through this area, if you don't already have one.

Message Options

If you have a web site and want to add your QMTP messaging system to that site, this is where you'd go to get and customize the code to add to your web page. Using this feature will put an end to having to list your email address as a contact, which in turn stops the harvesting of your email address by bots who want to send you spam.

Quikonnex Forums

Your access to the wealth of information contained in the Q Forums.

Your Referrals

This is where you can view a list of all Quikonnex members you have referred, and access their QMTP, to send them a private message.

View Stats

This is where you check up on referral commissions and request payment for any commissions owed.

Your Ad Campaigns

In this section you can set up and review your advertising campaigns with regard to your promotion of Quikonnex.

Banners and Graphics

This is where you will find promotional items for Quikonnex.

Install QuikView

QuikView is a browser enhancement that opens as a sidebar in your browser. It offers similar features as the DeskView, but it is a little more limited. However, QuikView will work with Mac systems and a wide variety of browsers, whereas the DeskView system can only be used by PC users, as it has its own integrated browser. *So, Publishers... You should always invite your subscribers to install QuikView, in the event that some of them are using a Mac computer.*

Contact Support

This one is pretty self explanatory.

If you have the latest version of DeskView, you will see this icon in your panel as well...



This icon represents the latest add-on offered by Quikonnex.

The Publishers Area



This area is for publishers only. You must have an upgraded account to be able to get into this area. If you are not a publisher, there is nothing in here that you will need.

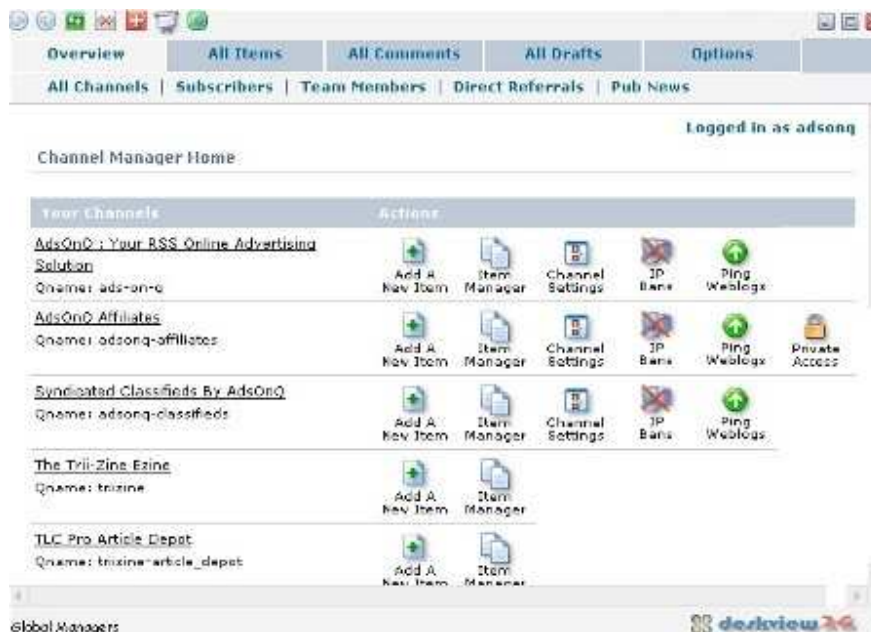
BUT...

If you are a publisher, you will probably spend a great deal of time in this panel. This is where you control the channels you publish, the QuikViews and DeskViews you create, and so much more.

You may notice that some of these icons are the same as those found in the Members Area. This is so you don't need to switch back and forth between the two.

Global Managers

This icon opens a new window where you will find all of the controls to every channel you have administration permissions to through your publisher account.



This is a shot of my AdsOnQ Global Manager.

From here you can add or edit items to your channel, ban IP addresses, ping weblogs.com, manage your private, password protected channels, and customize the way your channel looks to the rest of the world.

Add New Item

Use this icon to quickly submit a new item to your channel.

Create a Channel

Click on this icon to create a new channel. The window that opens will guide you through a step-by-step wizard for creating a new channel.

Key Codes & Invites

As a publisher, you can create your own DeskView to give to your channel subscribers. After creating a DeskView of your own, you would use this icon to open a page that generates a key code for your subscribers to use when activating your DeskView.

Templates and Code Generators

DeskView Settings

This is where you would go to create your DeskView for distribution to your subscribers. Again, you are presented with a form to be filled out, which sets the design for your custom DeskView. **QuikView Settings** is for designing your customized QuikView application and works very much like the DeskView Settings icon.

Products & Packages

The last icon in this panel is the same as the Add-Ons icon in the Members Area.

Some of the above icons are repeated in this lower panel for convenience. I will cover the icons not previously discussed. (*Right image*)

View Channel

This icon will open a browser window which displays the main channel that the DeskView is tuned to.

Private Access

Clicking this icon will open a window that will allow you to set up password protected (*private*) channels and to administer who has access to your private channels.

Comment Manager

Here you can view, and delete comments posted to your channels. If you should come across a comment that was posted which you find inappropriate in some way, you can copy the IP address, captured by the system, and add it to your Banned IP list, preventing anyone using that IP from posting again. (**See IP Bans**) Then simply delete the comment.

Team Members

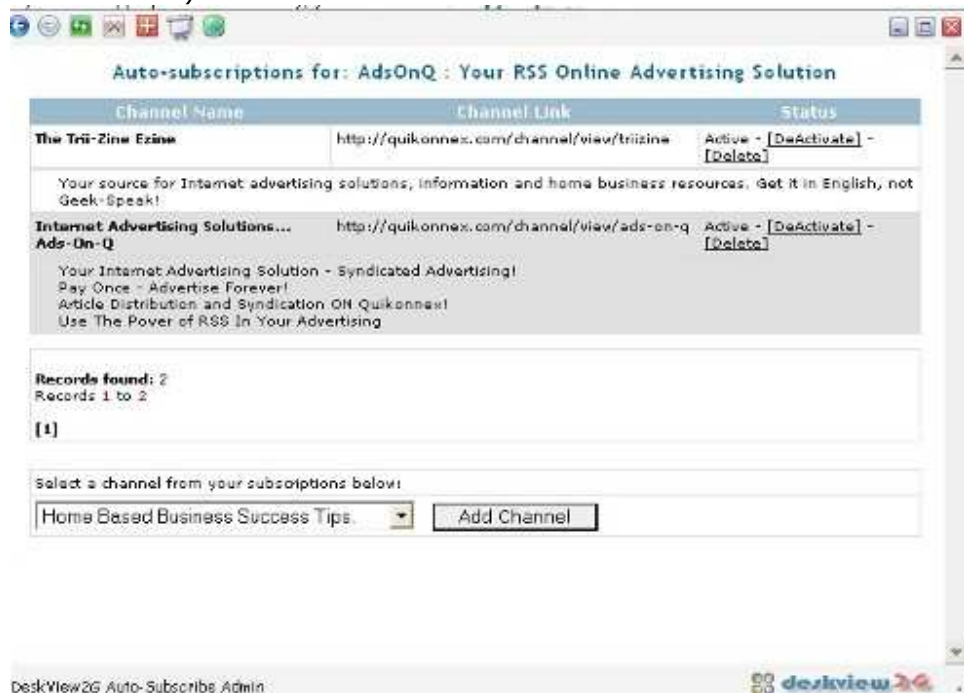
This area is where you can set up others to co-publish a channel with you, and control who has access to your channel manager.

Auto-subscribe

If you publish more than one channel, or you want to offer a subscription to another Quikonnex channel to a subscriber, you can use auto-subscribe. This feature will automatically subscribe



your DeskView user to any Quikonnex channel you want them to read. (They always have the option to unsubscribe.)



The above image is the auto-subscribe window for the AdsOnQ channel. Subscribers to [AdsOnQ](#) are automatically subscribed to the [Trii-Zine Ezine](#). At the bottom of the image, you will see a drop down menu with a button next to it (*Add Channel*). From the drop down menu you should see all of the Quikonnex channels you are personally subscribed to. If you want to include any of them in your auto-subscriptions, just select the channel and click on the Add Channel button. It's that easy!

Sub & Syn Codes

This icon will open a window that allows you to customize the java script or PHP syndication code that you would use to add your channel content to a static web page. This is a very valuable tool, as syndication of your channel on other web sites is what makes RSS publishing so viral.

Directory Listing

This icon is important too! Use this to add your channel to the Quikonnex channel directory. If you're not in the directory, you will be more difficult to find. If your channel is already listed in the directory, clicking this icon will permit you to see what your listing looks like, and to contact Quikonnex, if you'd like to change it.
